## This Month in Needs Assessment: Planning Wrap Up, a Break, and an FAQ



For some of you, this month may conclude your planning work for the Needs Assessment. You've got your team leads, you're clear on what data is being gathered and how, and you've started scheduling interviews/focus groups and task completion. It's time to get out and do it! Probably in the new year...Enjoy a break and when you're ready, reminders for each component are below.

Environmental Scan: Collect data for the Brick and Mortar, Charitable Gaming, Community Walk, and Passive Media scans. Complete the online questionnaire for each data collection activity (transferring data from paper worksheets, if used).

<u>Gaming/Gambling Community Readiness Assessment</u>: The next phases are Outreach and Data Collection: setting up meetings and documenting interviews/focus groups with stakeholders.

### **Community Spotlight** Fairfax-Falls Church Offers Youth Mental Health Project Grants



Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board, with support from the DBHDS-funded Suicide Prevention Alliance of Northern Virginia, offered their second annual mini-grants for youth-led projects to reduce stigma among their peers. The mini-grants fund youth-planned, youth-led projects within Fairfax County, Fairfax City, and Falls Church City, to be completed by August 15, 2022. A total of \$6,000 was awarded, disseminated in increments of \$1,000 each or less. Previous awards have funded efforts such as positive messaging campaigns and information dissemination, contests, events, and the creation of safe spaces for mental health and wellness. All created and implemented by youth!
