

Adding Problem Gambling to your FY22-23 Roadmap

How to View Your CSB's Rejected Activities

Did you know there are multiple ways to view your rejected activities in PBPS? You can find them in the following places:

- 1. Listed in the bottom right quadrant of your account dashboard, organized by date of rejection.
- 2. Listed underneath pending activities in the **Implement Channel**, organized by activity date.

Note: Use the filter button to limit the type of activities displayed by changing the status to "Rejected". Please also make sure the date range is broad enough to capture any activities that may have been rejected during this fiscal year.

3. By running a Rejected Activities Report in the **Evaluate Channel**, also organized by activity date.

You can find this at the top right corner of the evaluation channel page. These reports can be exported into an excel file which may be useful if you'd like to keep track of the type of activities that are commonly rejected and the reasons for rejection. This can help your CSB adjust the way certain data are entered to avoid common mistakes and save your staff time and energy.



How to Capture Demographics for the New Item Distribution Campaigns

In previous years, each type of device distributed needed to be entered as one individual activity per date distributed. Starting FY 22-23, if your campaign falls into one of the following strategies, you can <u>enter all the indicated items that were distributed at that event in one activity</u> by providing the number of items distributed next to the item name:

- Supply Reduction Item Distribution
 - Medication lock boxes/pouches distributed
 - Drug deactivation packets distributed
 - Smart pill bottles/Timer caps distributed
- Lock and Talk Item Distribution
 - Trigger locks distributed
 - Cable locks distributed
 - Lock boxes distributed

For these activities, <u>demographics</u> should equal the number of people who received items. For example, if 20 people came to an event and you handed out a lock box and a trigger lock to each person, you would record 20 lock boxes and 20 trigger locks distributed in the appropriate fields. Demographics will equal 20.

Note: The OMNI TA Team has shifted the schedule for ACEs evaluation data to every other month. ACEs evaluation data will be available in December, covering November and December results. "Our program has been collaborating more intentionally with our treatment/recovery teams to meet our communities' needs surrounding SUDs and opioid use. Our Peers teams consulted with the Prevention program to develop a Harm Reduction Kit for clients and community members. We collaborated with the leader of our Peers program to renew our contract with VDH to receive Narcan. We ensure that our treatment and recovery staff are trained in REVIVE!, including Peers, MH Case Managers, Outpatient Clinicians, and Support Housing staff at HRCSB. Developing this relationship with Treatment and Recovery has allowed us to maximize our resources and reach in the community."
